Dear members of the WSRT,

It has been an honor to serve the members of the WSRT for the past year as the Chair of the Legislative Committee. The committee is tasked with monitoring bills introduced at the state level that may have an impact on the licensure and scope of practice of Wisconsin's radiologic technologists and radiation therapists. Sandy Helinski, Randy Griswold and I communicate regularly when concerns arise. We also keep abreast of regulatory and licensure concerns with the aid of Michael Blumenfeld and Associates, a trusted and valuable partner of the WSRT for many years.

During the last legislative session, a bill was introduced to allow nurse practitioners to order radiographic exams and perform fluoroscopy. Currently the licensure statutes grant exemption from our licensure act to physicians, chiropractors, dentists and physician assistants. The proposed bill would have included advanced nurse prescribers on the list of exempted professionals. The WSRT along with the ASRT, the Wisconsin Radiologic Society, the American College of Radiologists and the Wisconsin Association of Anesthetists all opposed this bill. The concern with the sparse wording of the bill was twofold: there were no provisions explaining how advanced nurse prescribers are or would be educated in radiation safety and protection, and there were no provisions addressing oversight and supervision of the advanced nurse prescribers. Allowing this licensure exemption without ensuring that the advanced nurse prescribers were properly educated and supervised was of great concern.

With the help of Blumenfeld and Associates, Sandra and I crafted testimony to present for this bill hearing in late June. Just prior to the hearing, the bill was pulled from consideration. We will follow this into the next session in January 2027.

I look forward to continuing in my role serving the medical imaging community of Wisconsin and our patients.
